This Sunday's message, ..., Advent begins today with the First Sunday of Advent. During these days, we look forward, waiting in hope. We watch for the end times, when Christ will come in glory, Christ who was born for us 2,000 years ago.

Advent Wreath Blessing. Let us pray (pause) Father, all powerful Lord of Light, bless + our wreath of evergreens. May the increasing light of these candles brighten our minds and hearts to be steadfast in faith, joyful in hope and untiring in love, so that we are ready again to receive in true peace Jesus, the Light of the World, who lives and reigns with you, for ever and ever. Amen. (Sprinkling with holy water follows and first candle is lit.)

Opening Prayer: God our Saviour, you utter a word of promise and hope and hasten the day of justice and freedom, yet we live in a world forgetful of your word, our watchfulness dulled by the cares of life. Keep us alert. Make us attentive to your word, ready to look on your Son when he comes with power and great glory. Make us holy and blameless, ready to stand secure when the day of his coming shakes the world with terror. We ask this through him whose coming is certain, whose day draws near: your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever.

Introduction to the Scripture Readings (Year C) *Jeremiah 33:14-16* Jeremiah's prophecy looks to the day when a son of David will bring salvation. Christians see this fulfilled in Jesus. *1 Thessalonians 3:12 to 4:2* Grow in love, says Paul; be blameless when the Lord comes in glory. *Luke 21:25-28, 34-36* Jesus warns his followers to be vigilant.

He was just one of several speakers at 'Celebrating the Gift', an event hosted by the Archdiocese on Saturday to help people prepare for the introduction of the Lectionary from Advent (Sunday 1 December). Jubilee 2025: The Holy Father has announced that 2025 will be a year of Jubilee. The theme is Pilgrims of Hope. For more information, visit the official website https://www.giubileo-2025.it/en. A Facebook page has been set up that will highlight resources and events in Scotland - search 'Holy Year Scotland 2025'. To help us prepare, the Holy Father has established 2024 as a Year of Prayer dedicated "to rediscovering the great value and absolute need for prayer, prayer in personal life, in the life the Church. prayer the world". To help us prepare for the Jubilee Year, the Holy Father has asked us to study the documents of the Second Vatican Council. "Being Catholic" has produced a new video series, suitable for parish groups or individual use, presented by Fr Tom Magill of Motherwell Diocese. Invitation to any parishioners who would like to attend a discussion on assisted dying and the associated legislation being

considered at Holyrood and Westminster.

Our discussion will take place between 2pm and 3.30pm on Thursday December 5th in room 2F 13 Dalhousie Building, University of Dundee, Old Hawkhill, DD1 5EN.

An introduction to the subject will be provided by Professor Anne Kerr, Head of the School of Social and Political Science, University of Glasgow. Anne was the independent chair of the Nuffield Council's advisory board on assisted dying. In this role Anne worked with a citizen's jury of members of the public to consider views and ethical questions relating to potential changes in the law in England. This experience will be drawn upon in our initial contribution. This input will be followed by a facilitated discussion led by Dr Carlo Morelli - University of Dundee.

The joint statement of the Bishops' Conferences of Scotland and England & Wales, explains what 'compassion' means at the end of life – caring for and accompanying people, particularly during times of suffering. The statement strongly defends the vulnerable in society who are at risk through the proposed legislation, and the bishops advocate for better funded palliative care to be consistently available to everyone in need in England, Wales, and Scotland. "People who are suffering need to know they are loved and valued. They need compassionate care, not assistance to end their lives," say the bishops. "Palliative care, with expert pain relief, and good human, spiritual, and pastoral support, is the right and best way to care for people towards the end of life."
