

St. Luan's Church Stained-Glass Windows Explained.



Late last year, the idea of putting up the Stained-glass windows in St. Luan's as an outstanding character/feature of the church in readiness for the 125th anniversary was considered. It was made public and everyone had an opportunity to share in the work and the grace therein. Stunning work on the windows has now been completed. Inspiration:

1. The choice of the five Saints: Sts. Andrew, Margaret of Scotland, Ninian, Columba and John Ogilvie were inspired by their contributions to our Scottish Christian heritage. Of course St. Luan sits on the window left of the sanctuary as patron of this little but beautiful church while Our blessed mother Mary sits on the window right of the sanctuary.
