### This Sunday: Food 4 Thought

We always pray 'Lead us not into temptation' every day, and just as well. There are many things to tempt us and to pull us away from doing God's will. Once we have given in once, it is easier to succumb the next time. We have Jesus as our model who, whilst the Son of God, is fully as human as each of us. He was tempted but did not sin. Let us pray to him to help us when we are tempted.

Prophet Joel at the very start of Lent reminds us of God's invitation: "Return to me; with all your heart. Return to the Lord your God because he is tender and merciful; slow to anger and full of love." He asks us to return to the Lord because, with time and habits, we move away from our God and from his Word. Lent is a time to come back sometimes from afar. Saint Paul tells us: "Now is the

favourable time." Tomorrow does not belong to us. Yesterday is gone forever! Only the present moment belongs to us. It is now that we must return to God; it is now that we must pray; it is now that we must think about sharing.

Pope Francis recommends a few ways to fast this lent and tells us how: Fast from hurting words and say kind words. Fast from sadness and be filled with gratitude. Fast from anger and be filled with patience. Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope. Fast from worried and have trust in God. Fast from complaints; contemplate simplicity. Fast from pressures and be prayerful Fast from bitterness; fill your hearts with joy. Fast from selfishness and be compassionate. Fast from grudges and be reconciled. Fast from too many words/noise, appreciate silence.



Pope Says...: Grandparents and voung 'grow together' in fruitful exchange



Wheat and weeds growing together Jesus' first parable in the Gospel passage, said the Pope, notes that wheat and weeds grow next to one another in the same field, which therefore reminds Christians to be realistic in our outlook on life. "In human history, as in each of our lives, there is a mixture of light and shadows, love and selfishness," he said. "Good and evil are even intertwined to the point of seeming inseparable." He said that such a realistic attitude pushes aside ideologies and helps us realize that evil dwells not only "outside" of ourselves,

Pope Francis, who is staying in hospital, had a peaceful night and woke up. The Holy See Press Office reported that his health condition remains stable, without any episodes of respiratory fail-

On Thursday evening, 07/3/25, at the beginning of the prayer for the pope's health at St. Peter's Square, Cardinal Angel Fernandez Artime, who led it, announced his greetings; the first since his hospitalisation on 14 February.

Francis, with a weakened voice, said with apparent difficulty in Spanish: "I thank you from the bottom of my heart for your prayers for my health from the Square, I accompany you from here."

"May God bless you and the Virgin protect you. Thank you," added the pope.
